I am interested in exploring how we can find moments of togetherness and connection in an overstimulating world, where so many devices and media compete for our attention. It can be difficult to find moments of rest and reflection, and to preserve our memories and make them more tangible. While collaboration can be a powerful tool for building community, I believe that artworks themselves also have the power to foster a sense of shared experience and connection.

My work often has a dreamy tone, inviting viewers to enter into a space of imagination and reflection. Through my work, I aim to create environments and experiences that encourage people to slow down and take a break from the constant barrage of information and stimuli that we encounter every day.

For me, fostering connection also involves creating spaces that bring people together. Creating communal space extends beyond me making art and I am continuing to seek out ways to bring people together in different ways. I aim to explore the potential of public spaces, whether it's transforming a gallery into a park or hosting a picnic.

One of my main sources of inspiration comes from the imaginary worlds of online virtual spaces and games, as well as the early social media platforms of the 2000s. These immersive and playful environments evoke a sense of nostalgia for a time in my childhood when memories felt more tangible.

My creative approach involves using virtual spaces as inspiration and then integrating physical elements to ground them in reality. The mystical elements in my work help me to bridge the gap between the two worlds and provide a sense of connection that is both ethereal and tangible. In the work you can see elements of erosion, blurring and remaking the original object to evoke a sense of nostalgia and otherworldliness. By integrating these elements into virtual spaces and grounding them in physical reality, I aim to create a shared experience that people can long for together.

I have been a great fan of playgrounds for a long time. During the lockdown of 2020, I was walking around Amsterdam by myself, trying to find all of them. This fascination, combined with my interest for digital worlds, resulted in this desk-installation. I wanted to find a way to make a connection between both real and imaginative worlds, the playground creates a perfect link. The work refers to daydreaming while at work, wanting to escape the cubicle and to the silent pain of being too much of an adult to play. The melancholic space behind the screen is so close yet so far away.

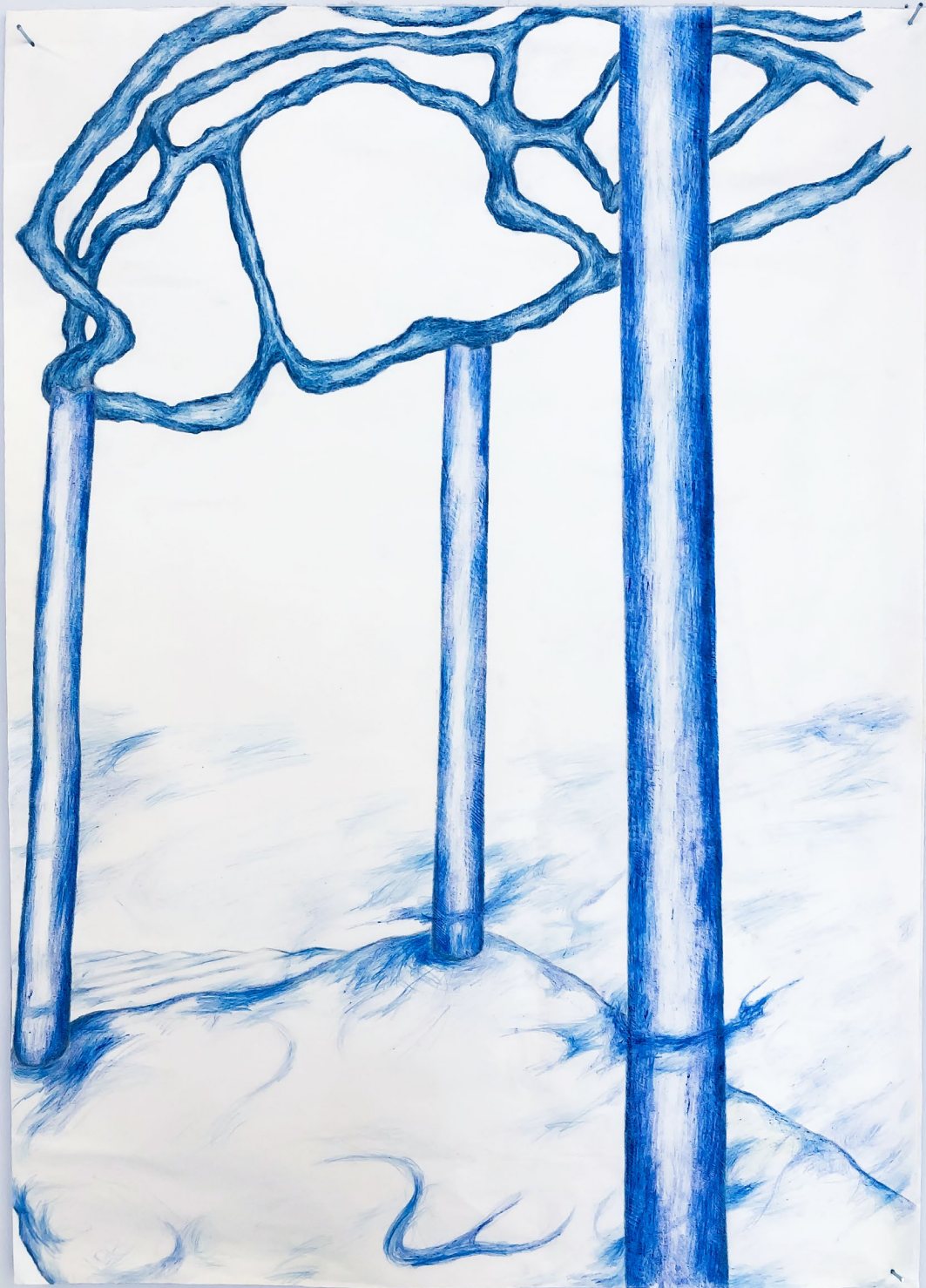

When we look through the portals we see the journey to a parallel universe, each portal showing you a different moment in time, frozen. Looking at them from the middle, the viewer is placed at an imaginary astral plane—the void in between the universes. The story originates from a conspiracy about the existence of parallel universes, the multiverse, and stories about entering the 'other' universe.



This installation was presented at the Rietveld Pavilion on 17/2/2022 by [Valley](#), an online radio, platform and label that unites people through forms of sound, text and visuals. The work was supported by a selection of musicians.
